



WINTER STORM INFORMATION – January 23, 2026

As you are aware, a winter storm is headed our way, with predictions of ice that may cause power outages. These are extreme temperatures for Texas, and we hope you have been able to prepare accordingly.

Tri-County is experiencing a power outage this morning that has affected power to the Town's water plants.

Portions of the Town's water system are powered by Oncor and portions by Tri-County. When there is a power failure at a water plant, residents should not lose total water service; however, low water pressure may occur. If you completely lose water service, it is possible that a water line on your property has frozen.

The Town has generators at some water plants that automatically activate during a power outage. If you live near one of these facilities, you may hear a generator running. The sound may be louder at times and quieter at others depending on demand. This is normal. Once power is restored, the system will require time to fully recharge.

Annetta's water systems rely entirely on groundwater. If you notice discoloration in your water, please run an outside faucet to help clear the line. Your water is safe to drink and use unless you are notified otherwise through official Town communications and emergency outreach.
