







## Weekly Report – June 5, 2026


 **Reminder:** The Town is currently in **Stage 1 voluntary water restrictions** through September 30 pursuant to the Town's Drought Contingency Plan. The goal of Stage 1 is to encourage voluntary conservation and raise awareness regarding potential drought conditions. As temperatures continue to rise, please be mindful of outdoor water use and irrigate conservatively.

An excellent resource is *Water is Awesome*, which regularly shares guidance on irrigation and other water conservation topics. You can also find helpful information on the Town's **Water Conservation** page on our website. Thank you for helping preserve our most valuable natural resource — water.


  **It's mowing season!** Please use caution around the Town's water meters and meter boxes when mowing or weed eating. Water meters and meter boxes can be expensive to repair or replace, and damage may result in charges to the property owner. Keeping these areas accessible also helps Town staff perform maintenance and respond to emergencies.

 There are no items scheduled for the regular **Planning & Zoning Commission meeting** on June 11, so the meeting has been cancelled.


 The **Parker County Master Gardeners** spent time this week working in the flower beds at Town Hall and at the Town entrance sign. Their volunteer efforts help keep our community looking beautiful, and we greatly appreciate everything they do.

 The Town's **Solicitors Ordinance (No. 150)** requires solicitors to obtain a permit before going door-to-door. If a solicitor comes to your home, please ask to see their permit. If they do not have one, please direct them to Town Hall to complete the application process and provide identifying information. Also, if you have a "No Solicitation" sign posted, solicitors should not approach your residence.



 **Summer road work is wrapping up throughout Town.** Streets currently being resurfaced include Wallis Road, Chapman Court, Royal Oak Drive, Shumard Drive, Portales Drive, and Meadow Glen Court. Parker County Precinct 4 is also spot chip sealing portions of Lakeview where the fiber installation damaged the roadway.

The chip seal portion of the project began this week. We appreciate our continued partnership with **Parker County Precinct 4** and thank them for everything they do for the Town of Annetta.

 A reminder that the Town's **Tree Maintenance on Public Streets Ordinance (No. 165)** and **Culvert Maintenance Ordinance (No. 200)** require property owners to maintain trees and culverts located on their property. Because the Town does not levy an ad valorem property tax, property owners play an important role in helping maintain these improvements.
