- Both pumps were installed this week at the Augusta Lift Station, which is now fully operational with a primary pump and backup pump.
- Council Member Shane Mudge has resigned from City Council after 11 years of dedicated public service. We wish him well as he begins the next chapter of his life in Colorado, closer to his family and especially his grandchildren. In honor of his service, the Town planted an oak tree near the entry of Town Hall.
- James Falconer has been appointed to complete the Place 1 term on City Council. The Town also welcomes new appointees for the Planning & Zoning Commission: Tony Endsley, Place 2, and Clay Kisor, Place 5. Longtime Commission member Mike Herring requested to move to an alternate position. Additionally, Amanda Falconer has been appointed as an alternate on the Zoning Board of Adjustment. We sincerely appreciate everyone's dedication and service to the Town of Annetta.



- We are excited to share that an agreement has been finalized with the Aledo Independent School District, allowing the Town of Annetta to install Flock security cameras at Stuard Elementary and Annetta Elementary. This project will be funded through the Town's Crime Control and Prevention District and will add cameras at each school to enhance safety and protect students.

- It's time for the 18th Annual Parker County Mayors' Food Drive!


