💧 Freese and Nichols will attend next week's City Council meeting to further discuss the proposed Parker County Public Utility Agency. Residents are encouraged to attend so they can ask questions and learn more about the proposal.

Freese and Nichols is currently conducting a county-wide water study, and the proposed agency would assist in planning future infrastructure needed to bring additional surface water to Parker County. It is important for the Town of Annetta to be involved early in these discussions and future planning efforts.

🏛️ Public hearings regarding proposed Zoning Ordinance amendments were held yesterday by the Planning & Zoning Commission, and an additional public hearing is scheduled for May 21 at 7:00 p.m. at Town Hall before the City Council. Residents are encouraged to attend, stay informed, and participate in the governmental process.

Following completion of the Zoning Ordinance amendments, the Town will begin workshops and a comprehensive review of the Town's Comprehensive Plan.

💧 Reminder that Stage 1 voluntary water restrictions are currently in effect through September 30 pursuant to the Town's Drought Contingency Plan. The goal of Stage 1 is to encourage voluntary conservation and raise awareness regarding potential drought conditions. Thank you for helping preserve our most valuable natural resource — water.

💚 Reminder that May is Mental Health Awareness Month and Water Safety Month. These observances serve as important reminders to support the well-being and safety of our community.

Residents are encouraged to remain attentive to signs of mental health challenges and to offer support when needed. As summer approaches, please also exercise increased vigilance around water. Always supervise children closely near pools and other bodies of water, as accidents can occur in a matter of seconds.
