 Voters overwhelmingly approved the renewal of the Town of Annetta’s one-quarter cent sales tax dedicated to street maintenance during the May 2 Special Election.

This sales tax funds 100 percent of the Town’s street maintenance program, and we sincerely appreciate the strong support shown by our residents.

The canvass of the Special Election will be conducted on Monday, May 11, at 5:00 p.m. at Annetta Town Hall.

 Public hearings regarding proposed Zoning Ordinance amendments will be held on May 14 (Planning & Zoning Commission) and May 21 (City Council) at 7:00 p.m. at Town Hall. Residents are encouraged to attend, stay informed, and participate in the governmental process. Following completion of the Zoning Ordinance amendments, the Town will begin workshops and a comprehensive review of the Town’s Comprehensive Plan.

 Pursuant to the Town’s Drought Contingency Plan, Stage 1 water restrictions began on May 1 and will remain in effect through September 30.

Stage 1 restrictions are voluntary, with a goal of achieving a 7 percent reduction in water use compared to what would have occurred without drought contingency measures. The purpose of Stage 1 is to raise public awareness regarding potential drought conditions and encourage voluntary conservation efforts.

The Town will continue monitoring conditions and will notify residents if a higher drought stage is triggered in the coming months.

Thank you for your diligence in helping preserve our most valuable natural resource — water.
