



Weekly Report – November 26, 2025

- Due to the holiday, we were not planning to issue a weekly report, but we wanted to share some important information. On Sunday, November 23, lightning struck the Town's water tower and damaged our SCADA system. Our Water Superintendent and our vendor worked overnight on Monday to install switches that will allow a temporary SCADA system to operate until a new system can be installed in approximately two weeks. You may experience occasional water pressure fluctuations, but you should not lose water service. The Town's operators will be monitoring the water system 24/7 until this issue is resolved. We are so thankful for our dedicated operations team.
- At approximately 2:00 p.m. today, a Syntrio crew (fiber installation contractor) struck a water main on Old Annetta Road. This resulted in low water pressure within the Deer Creek Water System and some water loss. The break was quickly isolated, and the service disruption affected customers in the area from Lakeview/Old Annetta Road to Lakeview/Live Oak. Water service was fully restored to the entire system by 3:30 p.m. The water is safe for all uses, including drinking. If you notice any discoloration, please run your outside faucets until the water clears.
- A reminder that Winter Sewer Averaging began yesterday. December, January, and February are the months used to calculate the water consumption average that determines your sewer rate for the new year. This year, averaging began on November 25th due to the Thanksgiving holiday.
- Be on the lookout for your water bill. They are being placed in the mail today.
