



Weekly Report – October 17, 2025

- On Saturday, October 11, the new pump that was installed on September 9 at the Augusta Lift Station experienced an electrical malfunction. A replacement pump has been ordered by Peterson Pump, the company that installed the original unit. The backup pump, which had already been ordered, is expected to arrive and be installed next week to serve as the main pump. In the meantime, Magna Flow is performing temporary pumping operations from two nearby manholes to maintain service until the lift station is fully operational again. Once the replacement pump arrives, it will be installed as the backup pump. We apologize for this unforeseen issue and appreciate your patience as we work to restore the lift station to full functionality. The Town's Water/Wastewater Superintendent is monitoring the situation multiple times a day and will oversee installation of both pumps. Please note that some odors may be present in the area during the temporary pumping process.
