

ANNETTA CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION DISTRICT

ORDER NO. 2018-01

AN ORDER CALLING AN ELECTION TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE CITIZENS OF ANNETTA, TEXAS DESIRE TO CONTINUE THE CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION DISTRICT AND TO CONTINUE A CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION DISTRICT SALES TAX FOR A PERIOD OF YEARS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Chapter 363, Texas Local Government Code (the "Act") provides for the creation of a crime control and prevention district within a municipality; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of the Town of Annetta, Texas (the "Town") voted to establish a crime control and prevention district within the Town which was subsequently created ("CCPD"); and

WHEREAS, Section 363.251 authorizes the CCPD Board to hold a referendum on whether to continue the CCPD and the CCPD Sales Tax; and

WHEREAS, Section 363.2515 of the Act allows a district to be continued for a period of 5, 10, 15, or 20 years; and

WHEREAS, the CCPD Board desires to hold a referendum on whether to continue the CCPD and CCPD Sales Tax.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE ANNETTA CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION DISTRICT:

Section 1: Special Election Called. An election is hereby called for the purpose of continuing the sales and use tax within the Town of Annetta for the support of crime reduction programs of the Annetta Crime Control and Prevention District. Such election shall take place on May 4, 2019, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. and will be held at Town Hall, 450 Thunder Head Lane, Aledo, Texas. As specified in Chapter 363.2515 of the Texas Local Government Code, the ballot language will be:

"Whether the Annetta Crime Control and Prevention District should be continued for 20 years and the crime control and prevention district sales tax should be continued for 20 years."

Section 2: Governing Law. The election shall be held in accordance with the Constitution of the State of Texas and the Texas Election Code. All resident qualified electors of the Town shall be permitted to vote at said election.

Section 3: Joint Election Agreements Approved. The election shall be administered by the Town of Annetta. The Mayor of the Town of Annetta is authorized, on behalf of the Board, to

enter into joint election agreements and contracts for election services with Parker County, conducted under the authority of Chapter 271 of the Election Code (the "Agreements"). In the event of a conflict between this order and the Agreements, the Agreements shall control.

Section 4: Early Voting Clerk. The Parker County Elections Administrator is hereby designated and appointed as the Early Voting Clerk and the Election Administrator's permanent county employees are appointed as deputy early voting clerks for the Special Election as indicated in the Agreements. The Parker County Election Administrator may appoint other deputy early voting clerks as necessary. The address of the Early Voting Clerk is 1112 Santa Fe Drive, Weatherford, Texas 76086.

Section 5: Early Voting by Personal Appearance. Early voting by personal appearance shall commence on April 22, 2019, and will continue through April 30, 2019. Early voting main location will be at Parker County Courthouse Annex, 1112 Santa Fe Drive, Weatherford, Texas and at such other locations established by Parker County, on the dates and times as follows, or as amended by Parker County:

Monday, April 29, 2019	8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.
Tuesday, April 30, 2019	8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

Section 6: Early Voting by Mail. The Parker County Elections Administrator shall be responsible for the Early Voting applications and ballots. Applications for early voting by mail may be delivered to Parker County Elections Administrator, 1112 Santa Fe Drive, Weatherford, Texas 76086, not later than close of business on April 23, 2019. Early voting ballots shall be mailed to the Elections Administrator at the same address. The Town Secretary is directed to forward applications and ballots she may receive to the Elections Administrator as may be provided for in the Agreements.

Section 7: Necessary Actions. The Board President, Mayor, and the Town Secretary, in consultation with the Town Attorney, are hereby authorized and directed to take any and all actions necessary to comply with the provisions of the Texas Election Code in carrying out and conducting the election, whether or not expressly authorized herein.

Section 8: Order and Notice. This order shall serve as order of the election, as required by Section 3.001 of the Texas Election Code. Notice of the election shall be given as required by the Texas Election Code.

Section 9: Severability. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Board of Directors that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this order are severable and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section shall be declared invalid or unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or

unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this order, since the same would have been enacted by the Board without the incorporation in this order of any such invalid or unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

Section 10: Effective Date. This order shall be effective upon its adoption.
