- A Winter Storm Warning is in effect for all of North/Central Texas with widespread impacts to travel and infrastructure expected.

The warning goes into effect for North Texas at 6:00 p.m. on Friday, January 23, and into effect for Central Texas at 6:00 a.m. on Saturday, January 24.

Please take precautions to protect people, pets, pipes and plants. Stay warm and safe!




- If you own a generator, please review the important safety information to the left.

- Please visit the “Utilities & Water Conservation” page and click on “Water Conservation” for helpful tips on preparing in advance for winter freezes, along with additional useful resources and links.

Downed utility lines, power company blackouts, heavy snow falls or summer storms can all lead to power outages. Portable generators are a temporary solution to power appliances. It's important to know that portable generators emit carbon monoxide (CO), a poisonous, deadly gas. Use these tips to avoid CO exposure:

- Use portable generators outdoors in well-ventilated areas at least 20 feet (7 metres) from all doors, windows, and vent openings. Measure the 20-foot (7 metre) distance from the generator to the building.
- Never use a generator in an attached garage, even with the door open.
- Place generators so that exhaust fumes can't enter the home through windows, doors or other openings in the building. The exhaust must be directed away from the building.
- Make sure to install carbon monoxide (CO) alarms in your home. Follow manufacturer's instructions for correct placement and mounting height.
- Turn off generators and let them cool down before refueling. Never refuel a generator while it is hot.
- Store fuel for the generator in a container that is intended for the purpose and is correctly labeled as such. Store the containers outside of living areas.



### Just Remember...

When plugging in appliances, make sure they are plugged directly into the generator or a heavy duty outdoor-rated extension cord. The cords should be checked for cuts, tears and that the plug has all three prongs, especially a grounding pin.

If you must connect the generator to the house wiring to power appliances, have a qualified electrician install a properly rated transfer switch in accordance with the National Electrical Code® (NEC) and all applicable state and local electrical codes.

### FACT

- ⚠ Portable generator exhaust is toxic and deadly. Do not stand or sit downwind of generator exhaust. If you can smell exhaust, you are inhaling it.

- Just a reminder that Winter Sewer Averaging began on November 25<sup>th</sup>. The months December, January, and February will be used to calculate your average water consumption, which typically reflects household consumption without the impact of outdoor irrigation.

- Be on the lookout for an upcoming ribbon cutting for the Rainwater Harvesting Ground Storage Tank. This project highlights the Town's commitment to water conservation, and we are thankful for the grant support from the Upper Trinity Groundwater Conservation District for this project.
