MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR:

Annetta Town Hall will follow the same schedule as Aledo ISD for inclement weather closures. We plan to communicate via Facebook, our website (emergency tab) and email notifications if the need arises. If you have not already signed up for email alerts, please contact us at info@annettatx.gov or call our office at (817) 441-5770 to sign up. In the event of a water or sewer emergency when the office is closed or after hours, please call our 24 hour number at (817) 565-4169.

We continue to monitor for the cold and winter weather precipitation coming in later this week. Below is the local forecast:

Wednesday	Rain likely mainly after noon. Temperature falling to 44 by 5:00 p.m.
Wednesday Night	Rain/freezing rain before midnight then sleet/freezing rain. Temperatures dip below freezing at 10:00 p.m. Low around 18 degrees. Winds 20-25 with gusts up to 30 mph. Most significant icing Wednesday night into Thursday.
Thursday	Snow/sleet much of the day. Accumulation below 2 inches at this time.
Thursday Night	Low 14 degrees.
Friday	Sunny and high 32 degrees.
Friday Night	Clear and low 12 degrees.

The Parker County Office of Emergency Services reminds everyone to follow the **Four "P's"** of winter weather safety:

- **PEOPLE:** Keep your family warm and check on any elderly family or neighbors that may need extra blankets, winterizing their homes or a warm place to stay.
- **PETS:** Dogs and cats get cold too. Bring them inside at night to keep them healthy and safe.
- **PIPES:** During cold weather, pipes may freeze and rupture, causing water leaks and damage to your home. Protect your home by opening the cabinets under kitchen and bathroom sinks to allow air from your home's heater to warm the pipes under the sink. Let faucets drip – as moving water freezes more slowly than still water. Insulate outdoor faucets and pipes with insulation or newspaper, and be sure to disconnect and drain hoses from outdoor spigots
- **PLANTS:** Either cover plants to keep them warm at night or bring them inside so they can flourish.

Residents should report power outages directly to their energy provider. Remember 911 is for emergencies only.
