Please thank them if you see them around town! Yesterday, The Town hosted an appreciation cookout to recognize and thank them for all they do for Annetta. 💧 🍷



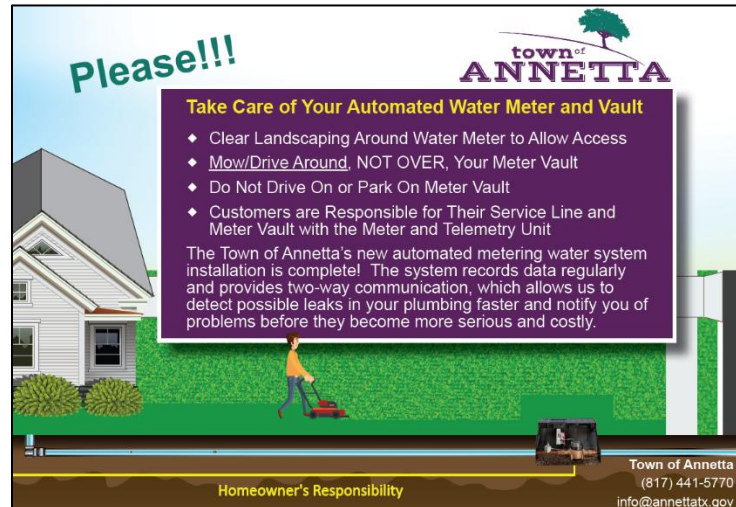

The goal of Stage 1 is to encourage voluntary conservation and raise awareness regarding potential drought conditions. Thank you for helping preserve our most valuable natural resource — water.

🚜💧 Remember that it's mowing season, so please do not mow over or damage the Town's water meters. Water meters and meter boxes can be expensive to repair or replace and damage may result in charges to the property owner.

Please use caution when mowing or weed eating around meter boxes and keep the area accessible for Town staff. Thank you for helping protect the Town's utility infrastructure!



♥ Reminder that May is Mental Health Awareness Month and Water Safety Month. These observances serve as important reminders to support the well-being and safety of our community.

Residents are encouraged to remain attentive to signs of mental health challenges and to offer support when needed. As summer approaches, please also exercise increased vigilance around water.
